

A Note from President Farvardin



This fall, Stevens launches the School of Computing — bringing computer science, cybersecurity, AI and related disciplines under one umbrella and making Stevens one of the few universities in the nation with a school dedicated to computing. More than two years in the making, the school is built on a "Computing + X" concept: ensuring that applications of computing connect directly to fields ranging from finance and healthcare to robotics, engineering and the arts, among others.

Acclaimed faculty member and former director of the Stevens Institute for Artificial Intelligence (SIAI) Brendan Englot will serve as the founding interim dean. Joining the Stevens faculty who will become part of the School of Computing are three truly exceptional new hires — Adam Coscia (Georgia Tech), Zhen Tan (Arizona State) and Noam Zilberstein (Cornell).

President Farvardin shares what this launch means for Stevens.
