Stevens' Strategic Plan-Midpoint Review: Appointment of Steering Committee and Participation Requested

I am pleased to announce the launch of a critically important effort to update and revise our university's decadal strategic plan at its midpoint and the formation of the Steering Committee to review and revise [Stevens 2032: Inspired by Humanity, Powered by Technology.](#)

Much has changed in our external environment since our current strategic plan was developed. AI has emerged as a powerful new technology that will impact many aspects of higher education and work in general, enrollment of international students is on the decline, the number of high school graduates in the US is declining and the public opinion about the value proposition of higher education is less positive than before. These changes have impacted higher education in the US and affected our university's enrollment, budgets and operations. Similarly, much has changed internally, as we have responded to the external forces that impact Stevens. For these reasons, it is ever more important to critically review our priorities, goals and strategies that will guide our work for the five years remaining in our 10-year plan.
