Student Eligibility Requirements (all recipients must meet the following minimum requirements):

- be enrolled as a full-time student at any ICUNJ member institution;
- be seeking a degree in a STEM major and an opportunity to conduct independent research;
- be entering junior or senior year;
- possess a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 on 4.0 scale;
- demonstrate a commitment to a career in a STEM field and/or interest in field that utilizes creativity, innovation and research as cornerstones of success

Additional Requirement(s):

Include in the personal statement information about current or planned research project with indication of anticipated outcomes. Statement should also outline career and/or advance study aspirations.

Deadline: **October 30, 2024**

Scholarships will be awarded for the 2024-25 academic year.

Candidates should apply for this competitive scholarship through ICUNJ. Each candidate must submit a completed application form with personal statement, resume, school transcript (unofficial) and letter of recommendation.

ICFJ awards are sent directly to the college or university for application to recipient's account. ICUNJ administered scholarships are to address the costs of attendance, e.g., tuition & fees, room & board, books & supplies, and transportation. Funds may also be applied to costs of conducting research.
